

## 2022 Connecticut Synchronized Skating Classic (CSSC) COVID-19 Policies

As of December 23, 2021

The purpose of these policies is to mitigate the risk of transmitting or contracting COVID-19 for skaters, coaches, officials, spectators, and volunteers at the 2022 Connecticut Synchronized Skating Classic (CSSC) at Quinnipiac University, People's United Center on February 19-20, 2022.

Policies may be updated prior to the competition.

### Vaccination requirement

- All spectators age 12 and over are required to show proof of COVID vaccination (two weeks out from 2nd dose of Pfizer or Moderna vaccines, or 2 weeks out from one dose of the J & J vaccine) in combination with a photo i.d.
- All officials and vendors are required to show proof of COVID vaccination (two weeks out from 2nd dose of Pfizer or Moderna vaccines, or 2 weeks out from one dose of the J & J vaccine) in advance of the competition.
- All coaches and credentialed team chaperones are required to show proof of COVID vaccination (two weeks out from 2nd dose of Pfizer or Moderna vaccines, or 2 weeks out from one dose of the J & J vaccine)) at registration.
- All volunteers are required to submit proof of COVID vaccination (two weeks out from 2nd dose of Pfizer or Moderna vaccines, or 2 weeks out from one dose of the J & J vaccine) prior to their volunteer shift(s).
- All age-eligible skaters are strongly **encouraged** to be fully vaccinated (two weeks out from 2nd dose of Pfizer or Moderna vaccines, or 2 weeks out from one dose of the J & J vaccine) prior to the competition.

### Mask requirement

- Spectators, officials, volunteers, coaches, and team chaperones are required to be masked at all times when in The People's United Center facility. (Fully covering both your nose and mouth, no gaiters) Masks may be removed briefly to eat or drink. Individuals are encouraged to socially distance as much as possible when eating or drinking.
- Skaters must wear masks at all times, including for pictures and awards, with the following exception:
  - If an entire team is fully vaccinated, the team may compete without wearing a mask.
  - If not all team members are vaccinated, the entire team must wear a mask when competing.
  - Chaperones and/or coaches of teams eligible to skate without masks will be responsible for the transfer of masks from skaters at the ice entrance back to the skaters at ice exit.
  - Coaches or team managers must attest to team vaccination status at registration and have photocopies of team members' vaccination cards at the competition for any team that is fully vaccinated and plans to remove their masks to compete.
